Because they work accurately and at high speeds, they save research workers' years of hard work. This whole process by which machines can be used to work for us has been called 'automation'.

Some years ago an expert on automation, Sir Leon, Bagrit, pointed out that it was a mistake to believe that these machines could 'think'. There is no possibility that human beings will be 'controlled by machines'. Though computers are capable of learning from their mistakes and improving on their performance, they need detailed instructions from human beings to be able to operate. Computers will also be used in ordinary public hospitals. By providing a machine with a patient's systems, a doctor will be able to diagnose the nature of his illness. Similarly, machines could be used to keep a check on a patients health record and bring it up-to-date. Computers are the most efficient servants man has ever had and there is no limit to the way they can be used to improve our lives.
