HOSTEL FACILITY

The college has excellent hostel facilities for both boys and girls and can accommodate around 275 boys and 300 girls. The boys' and girls' hostels are separately located on the college campus. The rooms are spacious and well furnished. Each hostel has its own air-conditioned mess-cum-dining hall, reading hall and office area. Strict discipline is followed in the hostels. Admission to the hostel is strictly on merit basis.

The college pays special attention to the general welfare and security of girl students. There are separate facilities for girl students[#].


RESEARCH CENTRES AWARDED TO COLLEGE

In recognition of the research culture at the college, Panjab University has awarded us four research centres in Biotechnology, Chemistry, Physics and Commerce. These research centres have been proactive in the exchange of ideas for the promotion of research through exposure to contemporary topics and events by regularly organising various expert talks, national seminars and workshops for the students[#].

DIGITAL CAMPUS

The college has signed an MoU with Tata Consultancy Services, which enables complete automation of all administrative and academic activities. There are two product solutions described within this contract:

- Campus Management System (CMS) enables the college to carry out various administrative activities. Every student is registered online which allows them to access his/her time table, attendance, leave, fee, grades, fines and documentation regarding library and hostel facility through this ERP solution.
- Learning Exchange Module helps faculty and students to share their e-content, assignments, PPT presentations, course schedule and other examination details.

COMPUTER LAB



INFRASTRUCTURE

Spread over sprawling 16.5 acres, the College boasts of a beautifully landscaped campus with spacious classrooms, well-equipped labs and modern facilities that promote an invigorating and a wholesome academic environment. The College has a centrally air-conditioned Administrative Block built under Building Management Automation System (BMAS). Besides the Administrative section, the Blocks also houses Principal's office, Registrar's office, Conference Hall, Management offices, Kaushalya Devi Verma Charitable Institute, Guest Rooms, a Mini Auditorium. The basement section has offices for the NSS, Placement, Publication, B.Voc KAUSHAL Kendra, Statistical Cell, UGC Grants Cell, Foreign Students and Scholarships, apart from the Office of the Company Secretary and a Conference Room and record rooms. The College has spacious classrooms, including smart rooms equipped with modern technologies, lecture theatres, seminar halls, and labs. The College also has a dark room, a succulent terrace garden, an herbal garden, and aquariums. The ultra-modern Main Auditorium of the College is fully automated, centrally air-conditioned and touch-screen operated. It has a seating capacity of up to 1000 persons.



The Television and Radio Studio-cum-Multimedia Lab, Central Instrumentation Facility Lab, Research Lab for Biotechnology, Research Centre for Commerce, and Fashion Designing Lab provide students with hands-on experience.



The Department of IT has smart classrooms, a server room, and eight dedicated, well-equipped laboratories including a hardware lab for B.Voc. Hardware & Networking course. The College is intra-connected with a gigabit network through a fiber-optic backbone cable allowing data rates in Gbps, which links 8 buildings of the campus and hostels to the main server. Wi-Fi internet access is available on the campus and in both the hostels. The Department of IT owns servers/workstations with backup facilities and various licensed softwares.

The College has generators on total-automation mode to meet the growing electricity demand, an underground water reservoir (UGR) with a huge capacity of 3 lakh litres, an on-campus branch of Central Bank of India with ATM and a fully equipped ambulance for emergencies. The College also has a 200-KW Solar Power Plant system, which will offset the carbon footprint by 292 tons/year of CO₂. The Mono Perc Solar Panel with 372 panels, each with a power of 540 Wp, can provide 800 to 900 units of electricity per day as per the available weather conditions.

The whole campus is under Surveillance Camera System with 116 IP-based high-definition CCTV cameras.





Pt. Mohan Lal (Commerce) Block, Prof. Roshan Lal Verma (Arts) Block, Science Block, a separate P.G. Block, Faculty Interaction Room, Girls' Common Room, Sports Ground, Boys' Hostel, Girls' Hostel, Recreation Hall, Gymnasium and Principal's Lodge form an integral part of the well-planned campus. A new teaching Block, called Block-C, has been recently constructed, comprising 10 new classrooms, 12 air-conditioned faculty cabins, 8 washrooms for girls and an elevator for differently-abled persons/persons with disability.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The Library Resource Centre-cum-IT Block is enabled with the state-of-the-art RFID (Radio Frequency Identification), integrated with ERP software named TCSION and KSMart RFID System from LIBSYS. The library consists of more than 72,142 books, 3,539 CDs/DVDs, 102 journals and magazines and 22 newspapers. A digital collection of the library includes 10,29,134 e-books (INFLIBNET N-List programme: a college component of e-ShodhSindhu consortium, NDLI, EBSCO eBook academic collection and McGraw Hill) and 6,000+ e-journals through INFLIBNET N-List programme: a college component of e-ShodhSindhu consortium.

Centralized Research Facility-cum-Digital Library has 15 i5 computers for students and 10 i7 computers for the staff to access e-resources, e-contents, CMIE Prowess IQ Database. JAWS, a screen reading software has been installed on two computers for facilitating persons with visual disabilities.

Information Services like OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue), Reprographic Service, ILL (Inter Library Loan), Internet Surfing, Current Content Alert, SMS Alert Services, Previous Year Question Papers Alert, Employment News, and Books of the Month are provided to the users of the library.

A Library Blog (<https://libraryggdsd.blogspot.com>) gives regular updates regarding library collections and activities. Sh. Upkar Krishan Sharma Digital Repository is home to a wide range of materials, including Pt. Mohan Lal's Handwritten Diaries, the college's annual reports, prospectus, e-newsletters, newspaper clippings, PU question papers and other electronic content.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

Zero Tolerance for Ragging

The college has a zero tolerance policy when it comes to ragging in any form. Any of the following constitutes ragging and is severely dealt with:

Any conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

Punishable Ingredients of Ragging

Abetment to ragging; Criminal conspiracy to rag; Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging; Public nuisance created during ragging; Violation of decency and morals through ragging; Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt; Wrongful restraint; Wrongful confinement; Use of criminal force; Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences; Extortion; Criminal trespass; Offences against property; Criminal intimidation; Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s); Physical or psychological humiliation; All other offences following from the definition of 'Ragging[#]'.

College Committee Against Sexual Harassment

The college is a safe place for students and staff and harassment of any kind is not tolerated. In case of any complaint of sexual harassment, the college committee may be approached and the matter will be severely dealt with[#].

Definition of Sexual Harassment:

- i) Physical contact and advances or
- ii) A demand or request for sexual favours or
- iii) Making a sexual coloured remarks or
- iv) Showing pornography or
- v) Any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of sexual nature.

Equal Opportunity Cell

The Equal Opportunity Cell works to assist students with any form of learning or social disadvantage and helps them to merge with the mainstream. It is the duty of the Cell to oversee the effective implementation of policies and programmes for disadvantaged groups (SC/ST, OBC, Minorities, Jain, Physically Challenged) and to provide guidance and counselling with respect to academic, financial, social and other matters. The cell also monitors the effective implementation of Right to Persons with Disability Act, 2016[#].

CAMPUS PLACEMENTS (2022-23)


- More than 250 students got job offers through campus placement


