Excellence is never achieved in a day. Excellence has a preface, A preface, no less than a saga made up of extraordinary events, real life heroes and a foundation ornamented with valour, initiative, sacrifice and faith. A

foundation, so deep rooted and concrete, which creates edifices emitting values, knowledge, thoughts to the society at large and a character to its inhabitants. That excellence is what Goswami Ganesh Dutta Sanatan Dharma College has achieved in its forty years of existence.

Right from its very inception, the college was fortunate to have been led by eminent stalwarts. 





Additional Seats

- Two additional seats for only sibling (single) girl child in each course provided she is otherwise eligible from all angles. In support of his/her claim an affidavit on stamp paper worth Rs. 20/duly attested by first class magistrate to be furnished by the parents of the girl child as per given specimen.
- Dependent children of Leprosy affected persons will be granted seat over and above the allocated strength of the course without considering any merit and of free education.
- One additional seat each for the student who suffers from cancer, AIDS and Thalassemia for admission in each course under each of these categories if otherwise eligible from all angles*.
- For Kashmiri Migrants:
 - 1) 5% weightage to be given and merit be determined accordingly, provided he/she fulfills the minimum prescribed qualifications (including Entrance Test).
 - 2) 5% increase intake subject to a maximum of 3 seats per course at entry point.
 - 3) One additional seat over and above the sanctioned intake in the all the new courses.

Anti Ragging Rules (RAGGING IS TOTALLY BANNED)

'RAGGING' means the following

Any conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

Punishable Ingredients of Ragging


- · Abetment to ragging;
- Criminal conspiracy to rag:
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- Public nuisance created during ragging;
- · Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt;
- Wrongful restraint;
- · Wrongful confinement;
- · Use of criminal force;
- Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences;
- · Extortion;
- Criminal trespass;
- Offences against property;
- Criminal intimidation;
- Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- Physical or psychological humiliation;
- All other offences following from the definition of 'Ragging'

Punishments

At the institution level:

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- 1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- 2. Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- 4. Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- 6. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- 7. Cancellation of admission.



- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- 10. Fine ranging between Rs. 25,000/-to Rs. 1 lakh.
- Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

Gender Sensitisation Committee Against Sexual Harassment

GGDSD is committed to provide a place of work and study free of sexual harassment, intimidation or exploitation. It is expected that all students, faculty, staff, karamcharis and officials will treat one another and visitors to the college with respect. All members of college community, including those who are in temporary or short term positions are subject to this policy. Anyone violating this policy is subject to disciplinary action.

Reports of sexual harassment are taken seriously and will be dealt with promptly. The college will respect the confidentiality and privacy of individuals reporting or accused of sexual harassment to the extent reasonably possible. Reprisals against an individual who in good faith reports or provides information, about behaviour that may violate this policy are against the law and will not be tolerated. Intentionally providing false information, however is grounds for disciplinary action.

What is Sexual Harassment?

Unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favours, other visual, verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature constitute sexual harassment when:

It is implicitly or explicitly suggested that submission to or rejection of the conduct will be a factor in academic or employment decisions or evaluations or permission to participate in college activity or when the conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's academic or work performance or creating an intimidation, hostile academic work or living environment.

Determining what constitutes sexual harassment depends upon the specific facts and the context in which the conduct occurs. Sexual harassment may take many forms —subtle and indirect or blatant and overt. For Example,

- It may be conduct towards an individual of opposite sex or in same sex.
- It may occur between peers or between individual in hierarchical relationships.
- It may be aimed at coercing an individual to participate in an unwanted sexual relationship or it may have the effect of causing an individual to change behaviour or work performance.
- It may consist of repeated actions or may even arise from a single incident.

What to do if you feel you are being sexually harassed

- Know your rights-sexual harassment is illegal, both the law of the land and the college prohibit sexual harassment.
- Speak up-If you can, tell the person to stop. State clearly and firmly that you want a particular behaviour to cease.
- · Get information and support- If you feel you cannot

 speak up, ask your friends to help you and bring it to the notice of the college authorities. Keep records that might be useful for pursuing the case.

What not to do

- Do not blame yourself. Sexual Harassment is not something one brings on oneself. It is not a consequence of certain ways of dressing or acting. It is a violation of an individual's right to work and live with dignity.
- Do not ignore it. Ignoring sexual harassment does not make it go away. The harasser may misinterpret a lack of response as approval of the behaviour.
- Do not delay. Delay in action increases the probability that unwanted behaviour will continue or escalate.
- Do not hesitate to ask for help. Speaking up may prevent others from being harmed as well.







Policy Regarding Hostel Accommodation

In view of the observations made by the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court directing the Municipal Corporation to control immoral activities of the students staying as paying guests at Chandigarh, the college has decided that hostel should be made compulsory for all those students who are non-resident of tri-city, (Chandigarh, Mohali & Punchkula). However, the student belonging to following categories will be exempted from the hostel occupancy, if he/she so desires.

- a) The student who resides within 25 kms of the municipal limits of Chandigarh.
- b) The student whose family has been transferred/shifted to Chandigarh.
- c) The student whose First Blood relation (father or mother side) is residing in the tri-city of Chandigarh.

The students will be required to furnish documentary proof to claim the said exemption.





Infrastructure

Spread over a sprawling 16.5 acres of land, the college boasts of a beautifully landscaped campus, offering a charming ambience to all its inmates. 
Student Exchange Programmes with Normandy Business School, France

In November 2006, the college set another landmark by signing a MoU with Normandy Business School, France in the areas of exchange of faculty members, exchange of students for both diploma and double degree at undergraduate and postgraduate levels, joint research activities, participation in seminars, academic meetings and professional development programs.

MoU with NSE

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed on September 27, 2011 between the National Stock Exchange (NSE) and the college for starting a new NSE Certified Capital Market Professional course. NSE was represented by Mr. T. Venkat Rao, Vice President Northern Region and Ms. Renu Arora, Manager NSE Delhi Office. The President of the College Governing Body Mr. Upkar Krishan Sharma represented the college. This course is a new milestone in raising the employment prospects for the students. The course is designed to make the students competent in Securities Market. Students of any stream are eligible for this four month programme. The certificate of the course will be jointly awarded by the college and the NSE.

- The college has signed another MoU with M/s Shalimar Infonet Pvt. Ltd. to develop a centralized MIS named as 'Campus Analyzer'.
- The College has also signed an MoU with Tally India regarding software teaching to students.
- Institute of Company Secretaries of India: The DCM is providing faculty, infrastructure and administrative help to the local chapter of ICSI. It is organizing preparatory classes of Foundation, Inter and Final stages of ICSI exams. The local chapter of ICSI is also situated in the college.
- Institute of Chartered Accountants of India: The DCM is providing faculty, infrastructure and administrative help to the local chapter of ICAI for running CPT and PE-I courses. It is also helping the institute in conducting examinations. It is the only centre authorized by ICAI for CPT coaching in Chandigarh.







Research Profile

The college faculty is encouraged to enrich their knowledge in inter, intra and multidisciplinary areas. The college faculty performs high quality research across a wide range of disciplines with a strong commitment to excellence and concern for the needs of both local and global problems. Various national and international conferences and workshops are attended by them. Staff collaborates strongly, generating multidisciplinary and innovative research funding. Our work is funded by funding agencies like UGC, New Delhi; DST, Chandigarh; DST, New Delhi and HSCST, Chandigarh. In the previous academic sessions, numerous research projects have been completed successfully. The college was funded to the tune of Rs 1 crore (approximately) by the various funding agencies to support research interest. In addition various major and minor research projects are funded by prestigious academic bodies including UGC, DST, DBT, HSCST etc. Many of our researchers published research /review articles in journals of International and national repute. The faculty members acted as resource persons at international /national conferences and seminars. Beside these, many of the faculty members of the college also offer research guidance to M.Phil. students from different universities. Strong research base gives students access to a wide range of cutting-edge expertise and modern scientific research facilities. The students of the college are encouraged to engage in healthy and meaningful research. In the final year, students choose and carry out a research project linked to a major research theme which can be laboratory, literature or computer-based. Every year under Star college scheme of DBT, numerous students of science departments are offered a fellowship worth Rs 4000 each, for the various research projects that they work on under the supervision of the faculty members of the college. The endeavour is to provide the students with invaluable experience about the intricacies of different facets of research work. While such initiatives provide the students with the invaluable experience about research work, it helps them in their professional and academic life later. A number of students of our college have cleared various examinations like CSIR NET/GATE, JRF, CA, CAT etc. and joined various reputed research/educational institutes for their higher studies.

Grants from UGC and DBT, GOI

The college regularly receives grants from the University Grants Commission (UGC) and different departments of the Government of India in appreciation of its high academic standards and impetus given to research in different fields. This year, the college has received Rs 23.75 lakh as additional grant for infrastructural development under 11th Plan for the session 2012-13. The total additional grant for infrastructure development received was Rs 48.75 lakh.

The college also received grant of Rs 44.88 lakh under 11th Plan from U.G.C and has received sanction of Rs 40 lakh under Scheme of Promotion of Basic Scientific Research for thirteen departments of the college. The college has also received a grant of Rs 16 lakh as the 4th release of grant for implementation of the project for strengthening of Life Science and Biotechnology education and training at undergraduate level under 'Star College Scheme' from Ministry of Science & Technology, Department of Biotechnology, Government of India. The college has received Rs 58 lakh as 1st installment under FIST program from Ministry of Science and Technology, Govt. of India, New Delhi. The grant is sanctioned to strengthen the teaching and research facilities in the Science Departments of the College. In addition to this, the college received Rs 20 lakh as 2nd installment under 'College with Potential for Excellence'(CPE) Scheme Phase-II. The college has already received Rs 25 lakh under this scheme. The total amount sanctioned under this scheme is Rs 50 lakh. This grant is sanctioned for improving teaching and research facilities in commerce and bioscience departments

House Tests

The college conducts two terminal examinations during the academic session and each student is required to compulsorily sit for both these exams. No student is allowed to take these examinations without valid Identity Card.

First Terminal Examination

The first terminal examination is held in the month of Septmber and is of one hour duration.

Second Terminal Examination

The second terminal examination is held in the month of December and is of three hours duration. The pattern of these tests is as it is in the final annual examnations conducted by the Panjab University, Chandigarh.

House Tests Rules

- Zero is awarded to any student who fails to appear in these exams, whatsoever be the reason of absence.
- A fine of Rs. 50 is imposed on the student who absents himself/herself in the terminal

- examinations without prior exemption.
- Any student who fails to fulfill the eligibility criterion, is required to reappear in the Special Test held in the month of March, provided the Principal permits him/her to sit for the same.
- A student found guilty of using unfair means in an examination is fined according to the gravity of the offence and is also be liable to detention or expulsion. It also automatically renders the student ineligible for the award of any prize, concession, scholarship or stipend for a year.

Eligibility Conditions for Appearing in the University Examination

Each student is required to fill up a University examination form in Oct./Nov.2013, for Annual exam, Sept.2013 / Jan 2014 for Semester exam which will be sent only provisionally to the Panjab University, Chandigarh for the annual examination to be held in March/April 2014 and semester exam to be held in Dec. 2013/May 2014. The filling of the examination form is subject to the following conditions:

 The student has displayed good conduct during the course of his/her stay as a bonafide student of the college.

- The student has attended at least 75% of lectures delivered in each subject, both in the theory as well as in the practical classes. (The lectures are counted from the day of commencement of teaching up to the last day of the session, when the preparatory holidays are announced by the Principal).
- The student has secured at least 25% marks as aggregate of all the subjects in both the above referred two house examinations held in the months of September and December.

Special Test / Discretionary Test

A student, who fails to obtain 25% marks in aggregate in both the terminal examinations for whatever reasons may be allowed to appear in a Special Test at the discretion of the Principal. Such a student shall have to qualify the special test by securing at least 30% marks in aggregate, failing which he/she will not be allowed to sit in the annual examination of the University.

In case a student fails to fulfill any of the above laid down conditions, the admission form submitted by him/her and sent provisionally in Oct./Nov. 2013 may be withdrawn even one day before the commencement of the annual examination and he/she will not be eligible to appear in the annual examination even as a private candidate.





Condoning of Shortage of Lectures

If the required percentage of attendance is deficient on account of certain sports/NCC/NSS/extra-curricular activities, educational excursions, etc. approved by the Principal, credit may be given by the Principal for the number of days for which prior exemption was obtained. This condoning would be over and above the limits provided in the existing rules and regulations.

At the end of each session, the college holds an Annual Prize Distribution Function, in which students who have performed outstandingly in various academic, sports and co-curricular activities during the entire academic session are honoured with numerous prestigious awards. The top honours include the following:

Library Facilities

Containing a wealth of endless knowledge and information, the library of the college, is well stocked. 
In addition, there is a special Post—Graduate Reference Section, which is well equipped with books and journals of both national and international repute, so as to provide an array of readings to the students. This is complemented by Resource Centre cum Digital Library which makes knowledge gathering an easy and effective process. The Digital Library is equipped with 48 PCs connected to a dedicated 10mbps leased line internet connection with firewall device to ensure secure and speedy internet surfing. To facilitate screen

reading for the blinds, 2PCs enabled with JAWS Screen Reading Software, have been added to the Digital Library. The books are issued upto 4 p.m. everyday, but the library's Reading Hall remains open from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Special Facilities

The college has carved a niche for itself in the world of academia. This has become possible because the college recognizes the need to evolve with the changing times and equip itself with the latest infrastructure and teaching-learning methodologies that are imperative to compete with the best in the market. It is with this motto that the college has set up a number of labs and smart class rooms which are equipped with facilities that help disseminate education that meets the highest standards.

Digital Library

Keeping in view the changing trends, a digital library has been established to access electronic resources and Internet services. Digital section of the library is equipped with 48 computers. For smooth and speedy Internet access, it has been connected with the 10mbps leased line connection. The library is member of INFLIBNET N-List Programme through which it provides access to about 4,000 e-journals and more than 80,000 e-books from different reputed publishers. In addition to these, Jaws screen reading software for facilitating visually impaired students has been installed on two computers.

Communicative English Lab

The Communicative Lab is equipped with 6 Mac Computers, 30 Pentium Dual Core systems with TFTs connected to the Campus Wide Network with its center at the Department of Information Technology. Top-of-the line software like Apple's Final Cut Pro, Quark Express, Clarity's Speech Skills and Business Writing, Sky's Pronunciation Suite, Chroma Photo Pro and the

Batch Water Mark are available in the lab. These are in addition to the conventional audio tapes produced by CIEFL, Hyderabad, Linguaphone Series and BBC Series.

Smart Class Rooms

The college has developed a new concept of Smart Class Rooms, which facilitate teaching by providing the latest interactive technology. Such steps help create a professional environment by using latest audio-visual aids like interactive meeting pads/boards, bluetooth, light touch pen, digital visualizer, DLP multimedia kits, high resolution digital presenter UF-80 DX / ST.

Centralized Research Lab

With the objective of promoting healthy research, the college has set up a state-of-the-art 'Centralized Research Lab.' The aim is to educate students and facilitate training in the critical application of research in the fields of Science, Humanities and Commerce. The centre maintains close links with professional bodies in order to provide programmes that are tailored to the employer's needs along with satisfying the academic and vocational needs of a highly qualified student. Research in a number of critical areas of interest is promoted with the help of latest infrastructure set up in this lab. The infrastructure includes a separate Cooling Centrifuge, Orbital Shaker, Deep Freezer, Incubator, Laminar Air Flow, Oven, Autopipette, Microfuge, pH meter, Magnetic Stirrer, Cyclomixer, Fast Prep, Water Bath, Gel Doc, PCR and Elctrophoresis, etc.



Extension Activities

Following the motto of duty and sacrifice, every associate of the college imbibes the Sanatanist values and spirit to the core and is encouraged to get involved in different spiritual and value based extension activities that are an integral component of all endeavours of the institution. The crucial needs and legitimate expectations of the community are given utmost importance and these factors are the guiding principles for organizing various extension activities like community development, health and hygiene awareness programmes, adult education and literacy programmes, AIDS awareness programmes, social work, medical camps, environment awareness and blood donation camps. These activities are organised vigorously by various clubs and associations of the college, including Spirit India, NSS, NCC, Manav Dharam Kendra and M.K.D.V. Institute for Women, in collaboration with GOs and NGOs and help stimulate student participation in community based service. Another feature added to these initiatives is that students are required to associate themselves with these activities and put in at least 60 hours of community service in each session.

NSS

The college runs two NSS units consisting of 100 volunteers each. The primary aim of NSS is to impart education through community service and to stimulate the participation of the volunteers in constructive and extension work in slums and backward villages, where they are encouraged and expected to solve the different problems faced by the inhabitants. Students of all classes are eligible for enrolment in NSS. In order to successfully complete the NSS training programme, each student is required to put in 120 hours of work during one session. He/she also has to attend a service camp. Enthusiastic volunteers are even selected for training and special camps are organized by the Directorate of NSS. By participating in such programmes, the students can reap different kinds of benefits too. Not only do they become socially responsible citizens, but are also awarded certificates which carry an additional weightage at the time of placements and admission in a higher class.

NCC

The college has been granted 2 NCC platoons comprising 52 cadets each. During each session, an NCC cadet has to attend 30 parades and 96 periods for the award of certificate. Like NSS, the NCC certificates also carry a similar weightage. In addition to these, if any student wishes to specialize or train himself for a career in the armed forces, it becomes mandatory for him to attend two camps during the three years of his stay in the college and participate in certain service attachments, as decided by the authorities. Cadets are also groomed for a regular commission in the army and paramilitary forces. Besides these, the cadets are also offered opportunities to participate in additional service training programmes like the Republic Day Parade at Delhi, Basic and Advanced Leadership camps, etc. As part of these training programmes, the cadets are provided a complete kit catering to all their needs. However, in case of loss or damage to these kits, they need to make good the loss.





Extension Activities

Healthy Practices

Quality education has several dimensions like imparting domain specific knowledge, creating skills, practical use of knowledge of skills, overall development of the personality for greater creativity and productivity, raising the spiritual quotient of students and creating socially responsible citizens. Realizing these important dimensions of education, the institution has adopted several healthy practices for the attainment of these objectives. These include the following:

Manay Dharma Kendra

Manav Dharma Kendra has been a crucial part of the institution right from its inception. It aims to inculcate sound moral and ethical values amongst all the students of the college. This body organizes activities and lectures during the entire academic session to heighten the spiritual quotient of the students, besides fostering ideals of a cosmopolitan outlook and universal brotherhood. All students are thus encouraged to become enlightened and awakened citizens of the society.

Social Awareness and Concern

The institute helps to organise exhibitions and workshops for fund raising, medical awareness and adult education. Such participation makes students aware of significant contemporary social issues and thereby contributes to the social and national development positively. Other than numerous such camps and drives, the college also runs a non-government organization of students and college alumni, ASHRA (Association of Students for Human Rights Awareness), which generates a strong sense of involvement and commitment in the students.

Outreach Programmes

The college aims at imbibing a deep sense of social concern amongst all its students. In order to extend a helping hand to the needy in our society and to ameliorate their condition, the college launches numerous outdoor camps which include eye check-up camps, dental check-up camps and blood testing camps in the slum areas, in and around Chandigarh. Students are encouraged to

work for at least 60 hours with an NGO of their choice in each academic session. The college recognizes and celebrates such service rendered by the students and honours them in turn with Certificates of Distinction.

Cultural Enlightenment

We organize numerous cultural fests and fairs throughout the session. We also celebrate all important festivals and days that are integral to our history and culture. The endeavour is to encourage the students to participate zealously in these celebrations and thereby acquaint themselves with the significance of these occasions. Some of the important days and festivals that we celebrate with full fervour in college include the Independence Day, Republic Day, Jananashtami, Teej, Gurpurav, Diwali, Lohri, Basant Panchami, Baisakhi, Navratras, etc. We believe that such initiatives go a long way in sensitizing the students about the rich cultural heritage that India is endowed with.



Value Addition

We constantly motivate and train students to enhance their potential market employability. The students are encouraged to take up professional courses like C.A. / C.S. / C.F.A. / Computer courses, etc. along with their regular courses.

General Tutorial System

In order to inculcate spiritual, ethical, moral and Sanatanist values in the students and channelize their energies in a positive direction, the college runs an elaborate General Tutorial System. Under this system, every student is placed under the personal guidance of a tutor who maintains a complete record of his/her progress and acts as a personal counsellor and moral guide to the student. The tutor also acts as a local guardian and the students are advised to remain in constant touch with him/her. General tutorial lectures are held once a month.

Participative Learning

Students are encouraged to organize different events that may be general in nature or specifically related to their subject. Such exercises help the students in applying the knowledge acquired in the classrooms, as they put to use their different sets of skills in the practical world. Some such initiatives include the following: Every year the students of the Post-Graduate Diploma in Mass Communication bring out a newsletter "Expressions," through which they not only hone their writing and editing skills, but also gain first hand practical experience of page making and page designing. The students are also encouraged to edit various publications of the college, including the college magazine 'Tyagmurti.' It is through such endeavours that the students gain actual hands on experience that holds them in good stead.







Student Support & Progression Programme

Counselling Cell

The college runs a very active Counselling Cell that forever strives to cater to the various emotional needs of the students. Special counselling sessions are held with the students residing in hostels, to facilitate their adjustment and to cater to their special emotional needs. In addition to this, the cell also organizes regular career counselling programmes the year round, in which the students are scientifically tested for their aptitude, interest, personality & intelligence on psychometric tests and measures. Detailed profile of each student is prepared and personalized counselling sessions are conducted absolutely free of cost.

Medical Facilities

At the beginning of the session, every student of the college is examined by the college doctors. If any student falls sick or suffers from any medical emergency during the college hours, every sort of medical assistance is provided to him/her and all the expenses of the treatment are borne by the college. There is also a provision that the college would meet all the medical expenses of any hosteller, if he/she happens to be hospitalized during his/her stay in the college hostel. Other than these, there are periodical medical check-up camps that are conducted the year round, absolutely free of cost.



Accidental Coverage

All the students of the college have been covered under the accidental insurance scheme to the tune of Rs. 1,00,000/-. The policy covers the following events:

Sports

Fee Concessions/Freeships and Scholarships

The college provides scholarships and concession to the deserving students of the institution. These efforts not only help and reward the deserving students, but also inculcate in them a drive to perform better. The meritorious and financially weak students are helped through these scholarships and concessions which amount to a tune of Rs. 20,00,000/-. The book bank initiative, started by the college, aims at providing help to the deserving candidates. Scholarships are given to the top 10 position holders in the Panjab University annual examination system. An application to the Principal at the time of admission is necessary, if a student wants to be considered for the concessions. The institution with the assistance of Chandigarh Administration too provides half (tuition) fee concession to the students in case two children (brothers/sisters) of same parents are enrolled simultaneously in the college. Such siblings too should submit their application to the Principal at the time of admission. The institution with the assistance of Chandigarh Administration also provides (half) tuition fee concession to those students whose parents' annual income amounts to less than Rs. 1,00,000/-. For this concession, the student must submit an affidavit or salary certificate from the employer of his/her parents. In addition to this, economically weaker students can avail themselves of the concession by applying to the Principal through a written request for the waiver and/or the books at the time of admission. Students may also apply for scholarship/fee-concession during the month of August when the notice will be displayed on the notice-board. They may also contact Ms. Monica Sachdeva, convener of scholarship committee.

General Rules and Regulations

College Leave Rules

If a student wishes to apply for leave, it must be applied for in advance, on the prescribed proforma available at the college office/internet. An application for leave must be countersigned by the student's parent/guardian. No student will be allowed leave for more than 15 days in the session. Leave beyond 15 days will automatically stand cancelled. In case of medical leave, a medical certificate must be submitted along with the leave application. Leave will be granted by the Registrar. On the days when special functions are held, leave will be granted only by the Principal. Once leave is granted, show it to all the teachers concerned. If a student remains absent without leave continuously for six days, his/her name will be struck off the college rolls. Leave sanctioned will not relax 75% attendance condition. In order to become eligible for Panjab University annual examination, a student has to fulfill the above mentioned criterion under whatever conditions.

Procedure To Get Leave

- Get leave form from the fee counter or download the same from www.ggdsd.ac.in
- Fill leave form, get it signed from your parents (for day boarders) / local guardian / hostel warden (for boarders only)
- Attach supporting documents i.e. medical certificate, marriage card or camp selection letter etc.
- Get it sanctioned from concerned Dean Science/ Arts / Commerce, if the period of leave is upto 3 days.
- Get it sanctioned from Registrar, if the period of leave is more than 3 days.
- Show the first sanctioned part of leave application form to all your concerned teachers, deposit it at fee counter and retain second part for future record.


Identity Cum Library Smart Card

Each student is issued an Identity cum Library Smart Card bearing his photograph, name and roll number. All students are required to carry their Identity Cards with them while on the campus. The defaulters will be fined heavily. If the Identity Card is lost, a duplicate can be issued on payment of Rs. 100/-.

The Identity Card has to be deposited back at the end of the session. Defaulters will not be issued their No Dues Certificate / Detailed Marks Card / Character Certificate / Degree, etc. in case they fail to do so.

Girl Students

Special attention is paid to the general welfare and security of girls. Separate facilities like a Common Room for girls and separate tables in the college library have been provided, so as to help them feel comfortable. Arrangements also exist for providing adequate facilities to girls who want to take part in all kinds of sports and extra curricular activities. 


College Code of Conduct

The students of the college are required to observe the following code of conduct both within and outside the college:

- Maintain discipline and decorum. Ragging is strictly banned in the college as well as in the hostels. A student found guilty of this crime may be punished heavily. It may lead to expulsion from the institution.

- Bring the identity card daily and produce it, if any member
 of the staff or official of the college demands it at any time.
 Identity card may be checked at the entry gate of the
 college and those without it, will not be allowed to enter.
- Abide by all rules, regulations and instructions issued by the college from time to time.
- Inculcate high moral values of life such as truth, honesty and devotion to duty.
- Students must make the best use of time and spend it in creative and constructive activities for their own
 betterment and that of the nation, rather than wasting it away by hanging out casually in the college or indulging in futile exercises.
- Students should be punctual in attending their classes, functions and fulfilling the appointments.
- Sikh Students are expected to wear turbans.

- Exhibit fine manners and excellent behaviour, use decent language, be courteous and polite in dealing with fellow students and college staff, as this would add to your own credit as also to that of your Alma-Mater.
- Observe proper decorum in and outside the classroom and at the functions organized in the college. Students should respect their parents and elders from the core of their hearts.
- Students should endeavour to keep the environment neat, clean and beautiful at home and at college by using the dustbins and by avoiding littering.
- Quarrels and disputes should be avoided. In the event of a
 dispute, a written complaint should be made to the
 Principal at once. No one is allowed to take the law in
 his/her own hands.
- Students should understand that the college property is a
 national trust and as such its upkeep is as much their
 responsibility as that of the administration. Therefore, no
 one should disfigure furniture or deface walls with pencil,
 chalk or knife marks. Damage to the college property will
 not be condoned under any circumstances.
- Students are required not to remove chairs/furniture from any room.
- Students must keep their vehicles at the parking place.
 Plying of vehicles at the college campus is not allowed.
- Utilize free period in reading books, magazines and newspapers available in the library.
- Students must make it a point to see the Notice Board and read the latest notices. Ignorance of orders duly displayed on the Notice Board shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance.
- A student will be punished, rusticated or expelled from the college, if he/she directly or indirectly takes part or induces others to do so in any movement, agitation or strike in the college for any reason, whatsoever, which, in the opinion of the Principal is subversive of the college discipline.
